School Uniform

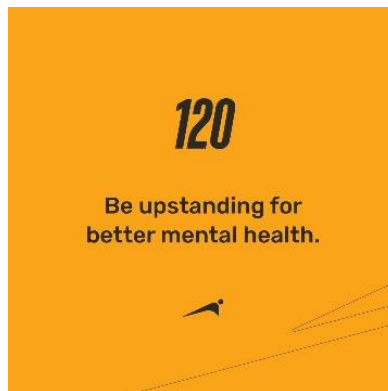

Pick Up/ Drop off and School times

There have been an increasing number of parents dropping off students at the crossing. This creates a danger for your child and other students as cars may not be looking for someone at this area. Please ensure that you are using the correct parking areas to drop your child off. I understand that parking is difficult but the safety of our children comes first.



A reminder that school begins at 9.00am each morning. If your child is any later than this, they need to be signed in at the admin office. School finishes at 3.00pm and we have a number of students not being collected up until 3.10pm at times. Please be prompt when collecting your child from school.

Student's Health Conditions

If your child has a health condition, the school needs to be informed. Please call into the administration office and discuss this with the office ladies. If your child suffers from asthma, we need an Asthma Action Plan completed by a GP. These Plans are available from the administration office. A puffer needs to be stored at the office fully labelled with the child's name. For safety and monitoring purposes if your child carries a puffer in their school bag we also need to be notified and an Asthma Action Plan still needs to be completed. If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to come in and see the office ladies.

Attendance

As part of our ongoing focus on children's attendance throughout the year, it is time we remind everyone that it is vital that your children attend every day to make the most of their learning opportunities. If a child is absent from school one day a week, by the end of the year, they have missed the equivalent of 8 school weeks of learning. Almost a term. If this continues throughout their primary education it adds up to 280 days missed. Over a year of learning lost.
