Year 6 students will be participating Weeks 8 to 10 (5 - 23 September).


### The Tell Them From Me Surveys



# **Maths-Garage**



You will need: a deck of cards, someone to play with.

#### Instructions:

- Shuffle the cards and place the pile face down in the middle of both players.
- Each player draws 10 cards each.
  - o Players organise their 10 cards in a row in front of them face down.

- Week 8 Term 3 Player 1 draws a card from the middle pile.
  - Player 1 places this card in the matching position in their row of 10.
  - o Player 1 then picks up the card in its place. For example, if a 4 is drawn, player 1 places the card in the fourth position and picks up the card in that position.
  - o Player 1 looks at the card and decides whether it can also be placed in their row.
  - o Player 1's turn is over when they can no longer place a card in their row. This card is thrown away as 'garbage'!
  - Player 2 draws a card to begin their turn and follows the same steps as player 1.
  - The first player to complete their entire row of cards is the winner!



### **Mathematics Learning**

Last week Mrs Stenfors, Ms McClure and Mr Hosken were in Sydney as part of our schools involvement in Mathematics Specialisation in Primary Schools Initiative. They participated in two days of professional learning with the NSW

Mathematics Specialisation Team. As part of this learning they listened to keynotes and participated in maths activities with both Australian and international educational leaders. They were provided with opportunities to work with the NSW Curriculum team and find out new information about the new 3-6 Mathematics Syllabus that will be implemented from 2024.

All 3 teachers came back with very "sweaty brains" and are very excited to work with our teachers and students to implement their new learning.
