Week Four Cooking Experience

This term, we have been focusing on Kindergarten in our home corner. The children have been dressing up in uniforms of schools in our local community, role playing going to school, being a teacher and learning some more school readiness skills to prepare them even more for school and build on skills for another year of Preschool.

The children have been sharing with their friends what school they are going to, telling each other about their orientation and how they are feeling about school.

The Kindergarten role play supports children to continue to build excitement, confidence and interest about school while sharing personal emotions and thoughts about school. We have also emphasised learning in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy such as writing, drawing, number and letter recognition, writing and naming as well as cutting, fine motor skills and following instructions.
